Reading Programme

Reading is one of the ways to enhance the learning of MTL. Extensive reading helps to spark students' interest in MTL, which will strengthen their confidence in using MTL to communicate with others. We strongly encourage our students to read a range of materials such as newspapers, magazines, storybooks of different genres, and e-books. We have year-long reading activities such as "Book Talk", "Reading Passport", "Reading Challenge" to cater to the different levels.

For summative assessment, there will be **WA1** and **WA2**, followed by the **End-of-Year Examination** in Term 4.

For Primary 4, WA1 will assess writing skills. WA2 will assess Language Usage and Comprehension, and all WAs will be conducted during curriculum time in Mother Tongue lessons. More details will be given by the respective MT teachers.





P3 MTL EYE

Students taking Standard MTL /HMTL are required to sit for four papers in the MTL End of year Examination.





P3 EYE MTL Oral



For the Oral examination, students will be given 5 minutes of preparation time. For the **Reading Aloud** component, students will be provided with a passage to read.


For Composition writing, the total weightage is 15%: 7% is allocated to Content and 8% to Grammar and Structure.

Assessment Criteria for HMTL EligibilityP3 to P4MT/HMT

P3 MTL Overall results: 75 or above

The general guideline for offering HMTL in Primary 4 is that students must achieve an overall score of 75 or above at the Primary 3 level.





Q: How would assessment look like for HMTL at P3 level for my child?

A: HMTL at P3 level will be reflected as a non-weighted assessment. Non-weighted assessment refers to assessment where the score will not form part of the computation of a student's overall results in a subject for the year. There will be no changes in the major exams. The school would also indicate your child' progress in HMTL in the Holistic Development Profile.



Q: How are lessons carried out for HMTL at P3 level?

A: For HCL, the textbook includes literary-based texts which require two additional periods per week (Wednesdays 2.15 pm – 3.15 pm) to provide an enjoyable early experience of ethnic literature and cultural knowledge. The schedule will be provided by respective HCL teachers in Term 1 Week 1. The Wednesday after-school lessons will start in Term 1 Week 3.

For HML & HTL, the school has adopted the implementation model of infusing HML & HTL curriculum into the normal curriculum hours.





Q: If my child decides to discontinue with HMTL during P3, will she be allowed to drop out?

A: Students who take up HMTL are expected to commit to the course for one full academic year. To truly benefit from the HMTL curriculum at Primary 3, your child should offer HMTL for at least two years to properly ascertain her ability to cope with the programme. However, to continue with Higher Mother Tongue in Primary 4, she must meet the specified criteria (refer to Slide 17).





Q: Can my child still offer HMTL at upper primary levels even if she did not offer it at P3 and P4 level?

A: Your child could still offer HMTL at P5 and P6 level when she builds stronger proficiency and interest. The offering of HMTL from P3-P5 is a parental option whereas the offering of HMTL at P6 is a school-based decision. You are strongly encouraged to discuss with the school which course best suits the need of your child.
