# Key Programmes

## • Reading Programme

Reading is one of the ways to enhance the learning of MTL. Extensive reading helps to spark students' interest in MTL, which will strengthen their confidence in using MTL to communicate with others. We strongly encourage our students to read a range of materials such as newspapers, magazines, storybooks of different genres, and e-books. We have year-long reading activities such as "Book Talk", "Reading Passport", "Reading Challenge" to cater to the different levels.




# Key Programmes

In our daily classroom teaching and learning, we use different tools of assessment – such as feedback, checklist, rubrics and reflection, to **help students identify their strengths and weaknesses and target areas that need improvement.**

For summative assessment, there will be **WA1 and WA2**, followed by the **End-of-Year Examination** in Term 4.

In Primary 4, there is no difference in the examination components for students taking MTL and HMTL. In Primary 5, however, **students taking HMTL will sit for two additional papers: Composition Writing and the Language Paper.**



# P5 MTL Weighted Assessments (WA)

WA1	2	Language usage & comprehension	30	15
WA2	3	Writing	30	15

For Primary 5, **WA1** will focus on **language usage and comprehension**, while **WA2** will be on **composition writing**. The WAs will be conducted during curriculum time, specifically during MT lessons. More details will be shared by the respective MT teachers.



# P5 Foundation MTL Weighted Assessments (WA)

WA	Term	Components	Marks	Weightage (%)
WA1	2	Language usage & comprehension	15	15
WA2	3	Listening Comprehension	30	15

For Primary 5 Foundation Mother Tongue Language , **WA1** will focus on **language usage and comprehension**, while **WA2** will be on **listening comprehension** . The WAs will be conducted during curriculum time, specifically during MT lessons. More details will be shared by the respective MT teachers.

**Students taking Standard MTL and HMTL are required to sit for **four papers** in the MTL Preliminary Examination.**



# P5 MTL Oral Examination

Components	Marks per section	Weightage (%)
Reading Aloud	20	10
Conversation	30	15
Total	50	25

In the P5 Mother Tongue Oral examination, the weightage is divided as follows: Reading Aloud accounts for 10%, whilst Conversation accounts for 15%. A key difference P5 students will experience this year is **the use of video stimuli** for the Conversation component, whereas P4 students use picture stimuli for testing.



# P5 MTL Composition Examination

For Composition, students will be given **a choice** between **Picture Composition** and **Topic Composition**. The grading criteria allocate 10% to Content and 10% to Grammar and Structure.



# Picture Composition



For Picture Composition, **eight helping words** will be provided. P5 students are allocated **50 minutes** for Mother Tongue Composition, an increase from the 40 minutes given to P4 students.

**Students taking Foundation MTL** are required to sit for **three papers** in the MTL Preliminary Examination.



# P5 HMTL Examination

**Students taking HMTL** will be required to sit for **two additional** papers: the **Language paper and the Composition Writing paper.**

For Higher Mother Tongue Composition, students **may choose between Topic Essay or Completing the Essay**. The grading components are the same as Mother Tongue Composition, but the weightage differs. Higher Mother Tongue allocates **20% to Content** and **20% to Grammar and Structure**, whereas standard Mother Tongue Composition allocates 10% to each component.



# Assessment Criteria for HMTL Eligibility

## P5HMT to P6HMT

General guideline for school to offer HMTL in P6:

1. Score AL4 (overall 75 and above) for P5 MTL
2. Pass HMTL
3. Pass English, Math & Science

The general guidelines for schools to recommend Higher Mother Tongue Language in Primary 6 require students to meet **all the criteria** above.



# Frequently Asked Questions

**Q: How can I support my child's Mother Tongue learning at home?**

**A: Encourage language use at home, provide reading materials and exposure to programmes, monitor homework, and practice comprehension and writing skills.**



# Frequently Asked Questions

**Q: Does the Higher Mother Tongue Language (HMTL) result affect the main PSLE score?**

**A: No, the HMTL result does not count towards the main PSLE score, which is based on English, Math, Science, and Standard MTL. Each subject is graded using an Achievement Level (AL) scale.**



# Frequently Asked Questions

**Q: What are the criteria for students to offer Higher Mother Tongue Language (HMTL) in Secondary 1?**

**Students who score AL1 or AL2 in their Mother Tongue Language (MTL) at the PSLE or achieve a Distinction or Merit in Higher Mother Tongue Language (HMTL), are eligible to offer HMTL in Secondary 1.**



# Frequently Asked Questions

**Q: What are the criteria to opt for SAP schools?**

**A: Students who took both English and Chinese at the PSLE can opt for SAP schools. They need not have taken Higher Chinese Language (HCL) in primary school.**
