#### 3. Total Defence Day

The theme for Total Defence Day 2023 - "Together We Keep Singapore Strong", focuses on the many ways we can put Total Defence into action in our everyday lives.

On 15 February 1942, Singapore fell to the Japanese. We mark Total Defence Day (TDD) on 15 February every year as a reminder of what could happen to us if we cannot defend Singapore ourselves; and to strengthen our resolve to keep Singapore safe, secure, and sovereign.

The school will be commemorating Total Defence Day on 13 February 2023. FTGP lessons and activities have been planned for our students to deepen their understanding of the theme of this year's TDD, "Together We Keep Singapore Strong".

The emphasis for this year's lesson will still be on how students can play a part in TDD and how they contribute to Singapore by being united and strong. During FTGP lessons, students will learn about the origin, purpose and significance of TDD, the different pillars of Total Defence and our roles in total defence. Students will learn these important aspects of Total Defence through engaging activities such as quizzes, games, stories, animations and reflecting on their experiences in their Magic Journal.

To create a cohort experience of showing awareness and gaining exposure about our safety heroes, the Singapore Police Force will also be included in the TDD programme. Police officers will provide an interactive vehicle display and carry out a demonstration focusing on key features in the vehicle which enable them to work efficiently. The students will also learn more about SGsecure through interactions with the officers.

To enhance the experience of commemorating Total Defence Day and help our students empathise with the hardships that our forefathers endured, we would like to encourage you to pack a simple snack item such as sweet potato, potato or plain porridge for your child's/ward's Snack Time on 13 Feb 2023.

## 6. P1 and P2 Character Education Programme

As an extension to the Character and Citizenship Education (CCE) curriculum, our school has worked together with the Parent Volunteer Group (PVG) to run two programmes catered to our lower primary students - Character Development Programme (CDP) and Character@Tinkering Courtyard (CTC).

CDP is conducted during some of the assembly periods and the values are fostered in the students through various modes such as presentations, songs, skits and crafts. The selected values are also aligned to our school values of Creativity, Graciousness, Gratitude, Integrity, Responsibility and Resilience.

The CTC programme aims to provide a platform for students to hone creativity and artistic skills, nurture team spirit and values as well as to provide platforms for them to bond and build strong relationships with their peers. It is held during recess as part of the free-play activities which students can choose to participate after they have taken their snack.

The range of activities include:

- Craft work e.g. customised bookmarks, festival-related crafts such as Mid-Autumn lanterns
- Values-based games
- Reading (character development themes)

It is always a delight to see our students enjoying themselves as they immerse in the activities with their classmates. The learning experiences planned for the sessions also provide them with an avenue to blossom in character and values while participating in the activities.
