5. Give@RGPS- Shoe Recycling Project

Give@RGPS is a student-initiated school-based project which builds character and active citizenry by involving students to improve the school through their contributions and efforts.

As part of sustainable living, Sierra Ziegler of 6D is initiating to run a shoe recycling project in our school. She hopes that the project would give sports shoes a second life. Gleaning inspiration from the ActiveSG's Old Shoe New Future shoe recycling initiative, she has initiated to extend this green movement to our school.

In support of Singapore's Green Plan, the Shoe Recycling Project aims to reduce waste by recycling the rubberised soles and midsoles of used sports shoes. They will then be ground up into rubber granules to be used as materials to build sports infrastructure, such as jogging tracks, playgrounds and fitness corners. These recycled shoes will also help to reduce the amount of rubber disposed of and incinerated, further reducing the amount of generated waste and extending the lifespan of Singapore's only landfill, Pulau Semakau.

The shoe recycling bin, a bin with orange lid, will be permanently located at the canteen dropoff point. The types of shoes accepted for recycling include rubberised shoes (i.e. sport shoes, school shoes, football shoes without metal studs), rubberised slippers and sandals without metal parts. Shoes should be dry and generally clean when dropped off. We do not encourage the donation of soiled shoes to avoid contamination.

The shoe recycling bin, a bin with orange lid, will be permanently located at the canteen dropoff point. With the upcoming spring cleaning before Chinese New Year, we hope to garner your support for this project to encourage your child/ward to deposit her used sports shoes into our school's shoe recycling bin. We encourage students to drop off their used sports shoes at the designated area before morning assembly, during recess or after school.

7. P5 Weighted Assessment

In line with MOE's direction to reduce school-based assessment and nurture lifelong learners, the school will not have any mid-year examination for P5. This will also provide our students with more time to adjust to the transition and adapt to the new demands of the level.

Although there is no mid-year examination, students' learning will continue to be monitored and appropriate support will be provided. Current practices to gather information about students' learning through class discussions, homework, topical tests remain to support students' development and achievement in learning.

Bite-sized forms of weighted assessments will be conducted in Term 2 and Term 3. The table

There will only be one weighted assessment per day and a maximum of 2 weighted assessments per week.

Please note that there will not be any make-up for weighted assessments and end-of-year examination. Students who are absent on the day of school assessment are to produce valid supporting documents (e.g. medical certificate) to their form teachers upon returning to school the next day. Student's performance for that subject would be captured as 'VR' (Valid Reason). The overall marks for that subject would then be pro-rated accordingly.

For cases of absence without a valid reason, results will be reflected as 'AB' (Absent). This would mean that the child would not get any marks for the assessment and/or paper missed.
