1. P4 Prefect Outreach- Donation-in-Kind for RHMC

The RGPS prefectorial committee has come together to initiate a donation drive in collaboration with Ronald Macdonald House Charities to put together a "Happy Snack Pack" for young patients either receiving outpatient care or undergoing day chemotherapy treatment or other procedures.

A child undergoing outpatient chemotherapy may be required to fast before treatment. The snack pack becomes not just an energy booster but also a "carrot" that motivates these children as they look forward to receiving a "Happy Snack Pack" from the nurse after the completion of the treatment. P4 Prefects will also be setting up a table during the P4 recess to encourage pupils to write get well notes to the recipients of the "Happy Snack Pack".

We hope that through this activity, pupils will be able to show gratitude for their own good health, empathy and graciousness towards others, especially those who are not as healthy and well as they are.

Each snack pack consists of a juice or milk packet, individually wrapped cookies/biscuits and gummies with natural flavours.

Pupils can participate in this collaboration by donating any of the food items listed below:

Ronald Macdonald House Charities Singapore Oncology Happy Snack Pack

- Individual 200ml juice packets of Marigold Apple Juice (no sugar added).
- Individual 125ml or 200ml Milo packet drink.
- Individual 200ml Ribena packet drink.
- Individually wrapped snack/oat bar from Carman's, Nature Valley, Uncle Toby's or Yogood (ingredients must not have nuts as some children may be allergic to nuts).
- Individually wrapped biscuits.
- Individually wrapped packets of gummies with natural flavours from The Natural Confectionery Co. (25% less sugar) or YumEarth (packs of 0.7g each).

Please note that expiry date of food items must be at least 6 months away from May 2023.

Pupils can deposit their food items at the table in front of the prefectorial board along the corridor leading to the canteen or at the canteen pick-up point. Items can be dropped off before morning assembly from Wednesday, 3 May 2023 to Friday, 12 May 2023.

4. Textile Recycling Project

As part of our school's Earth Day commemoration this year, we launched our RGPS Textile Recycling Project on 18 April in partnership with Watten Residents' Network and Land Transport Authority (LTA); and supported by Cloop, a local clothes swap organization and Life Line Clothing, a textile recycler. Together with our school leaders, teachers and a PVG member, a few of our student leaders and peers gathered to unveil the textile recycling bin and contributed pre-loved items brought from home.

This yellow textile recycling bin where students can place their pre-loved clothes and other textile items has been stationed just outside Gate 1A of our school. Not only can students recycle clothing, they can also recycle bags, shoes, soft toys, hats and caps, belts, household linen and pillows that are in clean and dry condition.

Through this project, we hope to instil in our students a sense of responsibility towards the environment and encourage them to take actions to reduce textile waste. We look forward to seeing our students learn ways to extend the life of their clothes through embracing sustainable practices, such as reusing, repairing, upcycling and recycling textiles.

We are also extending this meaningful project to the residents around our school community to encourage more to Get Green and Love Earth. We look forward to your support and partnership in nurturing our students to be responsible and sustainable fashion consumers.



5. Biodiversity Day Activities

We are excited to announce that we are celebrating Biodiversity Day on 15 May 2023. Our school has organised a range of activities to help raise awareness about the importance of biodiversity and to inspire our students to take on an active role in protecting the environment. As part of NParks Community In Nature initiatives, our school takes part in the annual BioBlitz for Schools, where the Enviro-Life Science Club members take part in a wildlife survey within our school campus. The findings from this citizen science activity will contribute towards a nation-wide initiative to document our urban biodiversity. Additionally, we will also participate in Green Wave, which is a worldwide biodiversity campaign that educates children and youths about the importance of protecting our natural environment. By planting 5 Pink Menpat saplings provided by NParks, we will also be adding to the One Million Trees Movement in Singapore.

The following activities have been organised by a group of passionate and dedicated individuals, including the Primary 4 and Primary 5 Green Ambassadors, the Enviro-Life Science Club members, a group of parent volunteers, and the Animal Concerns Research and Education Society (ACRES). 7. P6 Parent-Teacher Conference

The school believes in the importance of maintaining a close working partnership with our parents/guardian for the growth of our students and has established different channels to communicate with you.

We have organised Parent-Teacher Meetings at the beginning of the year to brief you on school matters. Subject teachers also used Parents Gateway (PG) to update you regularly on subject matters. Form and subject teachers will also call or email you to discuss about your child's/ward's growth and progress in school.

We will continue to leverage on the strong partnership with parents/guardian in our upcoming Parent-Teacher Conference (PTC).

We appeal to parents/guardian to limit the discussion to a maximum of **15 minutes** to allow other parents/guardian to meet the teachers punctually.

8. P4 & P6 NAPFA Test

The school will be conducting our annual National Physical Fitness Award (NAPFA) Test from 16 May to 25 May 2023.

The NAPFA test is **COMPULSORY** for all P4 and P6 pupils.

Pupils with medical exemption will have to produce a letter from the doctor. Please refer to the list of accepted exemptions overleaf.

Pupils on temporary exemption (e.g. MC on days of the test) will have to do the test on another day in Term 3. Pupils will be informed of the test date in Term 3.

We will be conducting the NAPFA Test in the morning during curriculum time. The <u>1.6km Run/Walk</u> will be conducted at the National Junior College (NJC) running track and the <u>5 Static Items</u> will be conducted at our school Indoor Sports Hall (ISH). Please refer to the NAPFA Test schedule overleaf for details.

Exemption from the NAPFA Test

The following categories of students are to be <u>completely exempted</u> from the NAPFA test:

- Students with medical problems (e.g. heart problems, soft bones, etc), as advised by doctors from the School Health Service (SHS) after the annual medical check-ups.
- Students with medical certificates for serious/long illnesses (e.g. cancer, hole in the heart, etc).
- Students with physical handicaps (e.g. one hand without fingers).
- New cases of severely overweight students who have yet to obtain a certification of fitness from SHS.

The following categories of students are to be <u>exempted from the NAPFA test for this</u> <u>year</u> if they have less than two months of training before the test date:

- Students recovering from fractured arm/foot/leg.
- Students who have just recovered from illnesses such as chicken pox and dengue fever.

The following categories of students are to be exempted from the NAPFA test on the test days and should take the test two weeks after they have recovered:

- Students with medical certificates.
- Students with parents' letters stating that they are not well.
- Students whom teachers observe to be unwell.
- Students who report sick.
- Students with minor illness such as mild flu, cold and cough (without chest infections), slight fever, menstrual cramps and diarrhoea.
- Students who have taken Covid vaccination should be resting for 2 weeks.
