The theme this year is **Singapore: Our Multicultural Mosaic.** This theme reflects how each community, while having the space to express its own identity as part of Singapore society, also intertwines with others to depict the unique cultural diversity that characterises Singapore life.

We are commemorating the special occasion in the week beginning 17 July 2023 with recess activities spread over 2 days (17 to 18 July). The main objectives of these activities are to encourage our students to:

- 1. Reflect on the importance of fostering harmony and understanding among all communities in our nation.
- 2. Know more about the culture and practices of different racial groups.
- 3. Respect and accept people for their cultural backgrounds.
- 4. Understand the various races and religions in Singapore.

To encourage students' appreciation of the four main races in Singapore and their cultures, we would like to invite students to commemorate the occasion by coming to school in ethnic costumes of the four main races in Singapore on 18 July 2023. However, in the interest of safety, students are to wear their white school shoes and avoid head accessories that may pose inconvenience to movements and obstruct their views.

Students can drop off the donated books at the collection point in the lower canteen before morning assembly from 24 Jul to 4 Aug 2023.
