1. Chinese New Year Celebration on 9 February 2024

The school will be celebrating Chinese New Year on <u>9 February 2024, Friday</u>. Students will report to school at 7.30am and be dismissed from school at **10.30am**. As indicated in the Calendar of Events issued on 28 Dec 2023, kindly note that 12 & 13 February are public and school holidays respectively. Students will return to school on Wednesday, 14 February.

1.1. <u>Attire</u>

To create a festive mood for the occasion, students are encouraged to wear their ethnic costumes on that day with school shoes. If your child/ward prefers not to wear her ethnic costume, she is required to come in school uniform.

1.2. Things to bring

There will be <u>**no**</u> lessons on that day. Students are required to bring the following items for their classroom activities during the CNY celebration:

There will be snack time as per normal school day. Please also ensure that your child/ward brings food for their snack break in class.

1.3. <u>Dismissal</u>

Do make the necessary transport arrangements if your child does not take the school bus home. Parents /Guardian will only be allowed to drive in to pick up the students after **10.45am**. Please observe traffic rules around the school and do not come to school earlier than the stipulated pick-up time for school dismissal. Enforcement actions may be taken against vehicles found parking indiscriminately or waiting before 10.40 am.

2. Hong Baos (Red Packets) Recycling Initiative

The tradition of giving and receiving hong baos (red packets) during Lunar New Year is cherished by many of us. However, we also recognize the environmental impact of discarding these red packets after use. In partnership with Bukit Timah Youth Network and Geneco, we will be placing a special collection bin just outside the General Office for the purpose of recycling the used hong baos. Starting from Wednesday, 14 February, until Wednesday, 28

February, students are encouraged to deposit their used hong baos into this bin. To facilitate the recycling process, we kindly request that students empty the contents of the red packets before placing them in the bin. We thank you for your support in encouraging your child/ward to participate in this meaningful activity.

3. <u>Commemoration of 40 years of Total Defence 2024</u>

2024 marks 40 years of Total Defence (TD40) in Singapore. As part of our commemoration of TD40 this year, our students will experience a food disruption simulation in school on 15 February 2024.

This TD40 Exercise aims to prepare students for potential disruptions to our food supply chain due to climate change, protectionism, or geopolitical tensions etc., given Singapore's reliance on food imports.

The canteen will not serve any form of meat (e.g. chicken, fish, pork and seafood) on that day so as to encourage students to be flexible in food choices and be open to protein alternatives in the event of such disruptions. Please support us by not including any meat items for your child's/ward's snack or lunch unless she has a specific dietary requirement.

There will also be fun-filled activities conducted by our PVG during recess from 15 February to 16 February to show students that they can respond by doing something to adapt to any disruptions. Following the exercise, students will reflect on their experience and share their thoughts and feelings with their classmates through a guided discussion.

Parents/Guardians may wish to engage your child/ward in sharing her experience with you and reinforce the important notion that everyone has a part to play in Singapore's Total Defence effort.

6. <u>Health Fair 2024</u>
