1. Inspiring Teacher of English Award 2024

2. Traffic Advisory

We have observed a disturbing trend around Watten Estate involving parents who park their vehicles to drop off their daughters in the morning. It has come to our attention that some drivers leave their engines running while waiting for their daughters and an accompanying adult to walk to school and for that accompanying adult to walk back to the car. This practice is causing significant congestion along Watten Road and Watten Rise, disrupting the smooth flow of traffic in these narrow roads. This also poses a safety risk to our students, other road users and residents.

To alleviate this issue, we strongly discourage parking along Watten Road and Watten Rise. If you do find a parking space that does not obstruct traffic, please switch off your engines if you are waiting inside your vehicles. It is important to note that according to the Environmental Protection and Management (Vehicular Emissions) Regulations, it is illegal to leave engines idling when vehicles are stationary for reasons other than traffic conditions. By leaving engines idling, drivers not only contribute to air pollution and climate change but also violate the law.

We sincerely appreciate your cooperation in keeping the roads safe for our girls and other road users. Let us work together to maintain a smooth and safe traffic flow in our community.

3. P1 to P6 Parent-Teacher Conference (PTC) on 11 April, Thursday (8.30am to 3.30pm)

i. The school believes in the importance of maintaining a close working partnership with our parents/guardian for the growth of our students and has established different channels to communicate with you.

We have organised Parent-Teacher Meetings at the beginning of the year to brief you on school matters. Subject teachers also used Parents Gateway (PG) to update you regularly on subject matters. Form and subject teachers will also call or email you to discuss about your child's/ward's growth and progress in school.

We will continue to leverage on the strong partnership with parents/guardian in our upcoming Parent-Teacher Conference (PTC) on Thursday, 11 April 2024, from 8.30am to 3.30pm. All parents are invited to meet the **Form Teacher** in the upcoming PTC. All students need not attend school on that day.

ii. The focus of the upcoming PTC is your child's/ward's holistic development as the wellbeing of our students is of paramount importance. During this conference, you will have the opportunity to interact and dialogue with the Form Teacher about your child's/ward's holistic development. The Form Teacher is a key figure in our pastoral system who takes the class for weekly CCE/FTGP lessons, conducts termly check-in surveys and engages in one-to-one dialogue session(s) with your child/ward. The Form

Teacher will also share your child's/ward's character strengths to help you better support her in developing her social and emotional resilience.

- iii. You will receive an invitation via PG from your child's/ward's Form Teacher on 20 March to book an appointment with him/her via PG from 21 March (8.00am) to 28 March (11.30pm). We appeal to parents/guardian to keep the discussion to a maximum of 15 minutes to allow other parents/guardian to meet the teachers punctually.
- iv. PTC will be conducted via video conferencing (Zoom). If you are unable to set up Zoom or meet via video conferencing, please email the respective Form Teacher to make alternative arrangements.
- v. Lunch break for teachers will be from **11.30am to 12.30pm** on 11 April.

4. <u>RGPS Value Ü Programme 2024</u>

The RGPS Value Ü programme, previously known as Value Sharing programme, will be implemented from Term 2, Week 1. The main objective of this programme is to encourage students to appreciate the authentic application of the RGPS values in their daily school life.

Value Ü also aims to promote students' voice and empowerment by giving our students the platform to show appreciation and give recognition to their fellow schoolmates. We hope that through the sharing with and recognition from their peers, students will be encouraged to consistently display the RGPS values through their actions.

Students will be rostered by their Form Teachers to speak to their classmates about the values assigned to them. This will be conducted in their classrooms every Tuesday morning before assembly, or during CCE-FTGP lesson time.

P1 and P2 students can submit their scripts in the Value Ü box in the general office.

5)	For attire, students will wear the RGPS school uniform (with pinafore).				
	Students who are performing dance items may wear their dance costumes.				
	Students who have special costumes related to the performance item (e.g. Frozen				
	princess costume when singing 'Let it Go') can wear it for their performance.

8. Purchase of Electricity Kits for P5 Pupils (Mainstream)

The P5 pupils will be purchasing an electricity kit. The purpose is for each pupil to have a personal set to allow them to individually explore the construction of electric circuits and the variables that affect the circuit in class and beyond curriculum time. Through exploration, they will better understand the work that goes into building a circuit and assembling the various components, learn the limitations of the circuit and apply problem solving skills while they troubleshoot.

The electricity kit consists of the following items:

5 insulated wires with crocodile clips A 1-cell AA sized battery holder A 2-cell AA sized battery holder 4 bulbs 4 bulb holders 2 knife-switches

Kindly note that there will be a collection of a fee of \$10.20/ kit.

If you have already filled in an application form to withdraw monies from your child's/ward's Edusave account to co-pay the expenses for the enrichment programme(s), once your consent to your child's/ward's acquisition of the resource kit stated above is received, monies will be withdrawn from your child's/ward's Edusave account in accordance with your application. You will be notified by the school if there are insufficient funds in your child's/ward's Edusave account and payment by other means is necessary.

If your child/ward is not eligible for Edusave, or you have not established the GIRO standing order, please make payment upon receipt of the school bill. Bills for cash-paying students will include a SGQR, which parents/guardians may scan and pay to MOE using PayNow or NETS scheme. Parents can also make payment via SAM channels of payment, kiosks, internet or mobile application and cash/cheque. The cheque to be addressed to "Raffles Girls' Primary School". Students are to drop off the cash/cheque (together with hard copy school bill) at the General office.

Kindly give us your consent on Parents Gateway for the purchase by 11 March 2024.

If you require any clarification, kindly contact your child's/ward's science teacher.

9. Information to Parents on the Prohibited Use of E-vaporisers

E-vaporisers are illegal in Singapore. Under the Tobacco (Control of Advertisements and Sale) Act, the possession, use or purchase of e-vaporisers carries a maximum fine of \$2,000. It is also an offence to import, distribute, sell or offer for sale e-vaporisers and their components. Any person convicted of such offences is liable to a fine of up to \$10,000, or imprisonment of up to six months or both for the first offence, and a fine of up to \$20,000, or imprisonment of up to 12 months or both for the second or subsequent offence. All prohibited tobacco items will be seized and confiscated.

MOE takes a firm stand against vaping. Vaping is categorised as a serious offence. When students are caught using or in possession of e-vaporisers, the prohibited product will be confiscated and their parents will be informed. The schools will report the offender to HSA and also manage vaping-related offences through existing disciplinary frameworks. These include taking school-based disciplinary actions, such as suspension. Students caught vaping will also be placed on cessation support programmes where counsellors will guide them through their cessation journey to effect long-term behavioural change.

You have an important part to play in your child's/ward's education. There are resources and relevant information that you can access on Parent Hub. You are encouraged to have a serious conversation with your child/ward about vaping to prevent it from becoming a life-long habit. 10. Waiting Areas Within the School for Parents/Guardian

As there are limited sheltered waiting areas outside the school, we would like to invite the parents/guardian to wait at the designated Parents' Waiting Area at the school canteen. Similar to the waiting arrangement when there is wet weather, parents/guardian of our Primary 2, 3 and 4 students will wait at the waiting area near the loading/unloading bay (Image 1) and the parents/guardians of the Primary 1, 5 and 6 will wait near the canteen (Image 2). As the Primary 1s and 2s will be dismissed earlier, the school would appreciate if the parents/guardians of our Primary 5 and 6 students stand at the back to facilitate a smooth dismissal process. The safety of our students is of paramount importance to us. Please do not block the exit pathways of our students. During rainy days, umbrellas should not be opened at the waiting areas. This arrangement will take effect on 18 March 2024.
