This meaningful event is designed to help students build positive relationships with their peers, appreciate diverse cultures, and embrace the values of respect and kindness.

In alignment with the new International Friendship Day (IFD) theme for 2025–2027, *Singapore: Forging Friendships in a Complex World*, this event will also encourage students to deepen their understanding of Singapore's role in fostering international cooperation and appreciating different cultures and perspectives. As the world grows increasingly interconnected, equipping our students with the skills to forge meaningful friendships will help them contribute to a cohesive and globally connected society.

Key Highlights of Friendship: Threads of Connections

 International Friendship Day – Students will engage in traditional games and crafts from ASEAN countries, with a special focus on Malaysia, our 2025 ASEAN host country. They will also learn simple greetings in Malay, promoting cultural appreciation and global awareness. Through these experiences, students will gain insights into how cross-cultural understanding strengthens Singapore's position in a complex world.

 Games Carnival – Students will participate in a variety of team-based sports and traditional games, reinforcing teamwork, resilience, and sportsmanship while applying skills learned in PE lessons. These activities highlight the importance of collaboration, mirroring how Singapore navigates international challenges through unity and cooperation.

 Odd Socks Day – As part of our That's Not COOL initiative, students will bring mismatched socks to wear in school as a fun way to celebrate individuality and kindness. This serves as a reminder to be mindful of their words and actions, fostering a more inclusive school environment. By appreciating differences, our students develop the openness necessary for forging friendships in an increasingly complex global landscape.

3. Donation Drive @ RGPS from Monday, 7 April to Wednesday, 16 April 2025

The RGPS P5 prefects have come together to initiate a donation drive for Lee Ah Mooi Old Age Home and Thye Hua Kwan Nursing Home. Information about the following two beneficiaries is included below followed by a list of items requested by them.

The Lee Ah Mooi Old Age Home was established in the mid-1960s by the late Madam Lee Ah Mooi who opened the doors of her Kampong Chong Pang residence to retired Samsui women and former Amahs who wanted a trained nurse to help care for them during their twilight years. Their philosophy now is to cater to the sandwich class of elderly – those who do not qualify for government-funded homes but also cannot afford the more expensive private homes with top priorities on affordability and personalised eldercare. Their mission is to provide affordable, professional and personalised eldercare services for the needy and sick in Singapore regardless of race, language or religion.

The Thye Hua Kwan Nursing Home in Hougang serves 285 residents at the moment and at least 114 of these are patients with dementia. The Nursing Home believes in providing quality of life for aging Singaporeans. Thye Hua Kwan endeavours to assist anyone who needs help in every way possible with full respect to their race, creed, language, culture and religion.

We hope that through this activity, pupils will be able to show empathy, gratitude for the food they have been provided and graciousness towards others, especially those who are not as healthy or privileged as they are. We also hope that this will help to highlight the plight of the groups of society being helped by these two organisations. We also hope that our pupils can become more aware of some of the issues our elderly and those with dementia may face.

We are pleased to inform you that the school will be conducting a **Primary 3 Learning Journey** in **Term 2, Week 6**. This experiential learning opportunity will take students to the **Geylang Serai Heritage Gallery** for the programme titled "**Tales of the Emporium.**"

Objective of the Programme:

Through guided fieldwork, students will:

- Learn about the history of Geylang Serai and the contributions of the Malay and Muslim communities to its development over the years.
- Explore personal stories from the Malay and Muslim communities about growing up and living in Geylang Serai.
- Understand the importance of Singapore's multicultural heritage and how it shapes our society today.
