1. Temporary Adjustment to School Uniform Policy

As we continue to experience unusually hot weather, we are writing to inform you of a temporary adjustment to our uniform policy. We understand the importance of ensuring the comfort and well-being of our students during these warmer days.

Effective immediately and until further notice, students will be permitted to wear their PE attire to school instead of the full school uniform. This decision has been made in consideration of the warmer than usual temperatures and the need to provide a more comfortable learning environment for our students.

We would also like to remind students to maintain the same level of respect in their appearance and behaviour while in their PE attire. Please do remind your child/ward to continue to adhere to school rules regarding appearance, hairstyles and keeping short, clean nails as stated in the Student Handbook.

Here are some important points to note regarding this temporary arrangement:

Guidelines for wearing of PE attire:

- PE attire should adhere to the school's dress code policy as stated in the Student Handbook.
- PE T-shirt must be tucked in when worn at all times.
- Please ensure that PE attire is appropriate, modest, and in good condition.
- Students should still wear appropriate footwear for school activities.

This temporary permission for wearing PE attire will remain in effect until the weather conditions improve and a return to the full school uniform is deemed appropriate. We will monitor weather forecasts and keep you informed of any changes to this arrangement.

Students should understand that this temporary permission is a privilege and should not be abused.

If you have any questions or require further clarification, please do not hesitate to contact us. We will continue to provide updates as needed regarding uniform policies and any changes to school procedures.

Your understanding and cooperation are greatly appreciated as we navigate these challenging weather conditions together. Our primary concern is the well-being and comfort of our students, and we believe this temporary adjustment will contribute to a more conducive learning environment.

2. Food Donation Drive for RMHC @ RGPS

The RGPS prefectorial committee has come together to initiate a donation drive in collaboration with Ronald Macdonald House Charities to put together a "Happy Snack Pack" for young patients either receiving outpatient care or undergoing day chemotherapy treatment or other procedures.

A child undergoing outpatient chemotherapy may be required to fast before treatment. The snack pack becomes not just an energy booster but also a "carrot" that motivates these children as they look forward to receiving a "Happy Snack Pack" from the nurse after the completion of the treatment. P4 Prefects will also be setting up a table during the P4 recess to encourage pupils to write get well notes to the recipients of the "Happy Snack Pack".

We hope that through this activity, pupils will be able to show gratitude for their own good health, empathy and graciousness towards others, especially those who are not as healthy and well as they are.

Each snack pack consists of a juice or milk packet, individually wrapped cookies/biscuits and gummies with natural flavours.

Pupils can participate in this collaboration by donating any of the food items listed below:

Ronald Macdonald House Charities Singapore Oncology Happy Snack Pack

- Individual 200ml juice packets of Marigold Apple Juice (no sugar added).
- Individual 125ml or 200ml Milo packet drink.
- Individual 200ml Ribena packet drink.
- Individually wrapped snack/oat bar from Carman's, Nature Valley, Uncle Toby's or Yogood (ingredients must not have nuts as some children may be allergic to nuts).
- Individually wrapped biscuits.
- Individually wrapped packets of gummies with natural flavours from The Natural Confectionery Co. (25% less sugar) or YumEarth (packs of 0.7g each).

Please note that expiry date of food items must be at least 6 months away from July 2025.

Pupils can deposit their food items at the table in front of the prefectorial board along the corridor leading to the canteen or at the canteen pick-up point. Items can dropped off **before morning assembly** from **Friday**, **4 July to Wednesday**, **16 July 2025**.

3. Racial Harmony Day

Racial Harmony Day falls on 21 July 2025. The theme this year, *Singapore: Our People, Our Tapestry*, focuses on the reflection and celebration of Singapore as a harmonious society built on a rich diversity of cultures and the collaborative effort of all to promote social cohesion.

We are commemorating the special occasion in the week of 21 July 2025 with recess activities spread over 2 days (21 July to 22 July). The main objectives of these activities are to encourage our students to

- 1. Reflect on the importance of fostering harmony and understanding among all communities in our nation.
- 2. Know more about the culture and practices of different racial groups.
- 3. Respect and accept people for their cultural backgrounds.
- 4. Understand the various races and religions in Singapore.

To encourage students' appreciation of the four main races in Singapore and their cultures, we would like to invite students to commemorate the occasion by coming to school in ethnic costumes of the four main races in Singapore on <u>21 July 2025</u>. However, in the interest of safety, students are to wear their white school shoes and avoid all head accessories as they may pose inconvenience to movements and obstruct their views.
