Our school will be organising the R U OK? Carnival from **1 to 3 July 2026** as part of our ongoing R U OK?@RGPS programme, which has been running since Term 2. 4. Racial Harmony Day

Racial Harmony Day (RHD) falls on 21 July 2026. The theme this year, **Singapore: Our People, Our Tapestry**, focuses on the reflection and celebration of Singapore as a harmonious society built on a rich diversity of cultures and the collaborative effort of all to promote social cohesion.

We are commemorating the special occasion in the week of 20 July 2026 with recess activities spread over 2 days (20 July to 21 July). The main objectives of these activities are to encourage our students to

- I. Reflect on the importance of fostering harmony and understanding among all communities in our nation.
- II. Know more about the culture and practices of different racial groups.
- III. Respect and accept people for their cultural backgrounds.
- IV. Understand the various races and religions in Singapore.

In addition, other Racial Harmony related activities will be held spanning across 2 weeks (13 July to 24 July) to reiterate the importance of social cohesion and mutual respect.

The activities include RHD-FTGP lessons; Assembly Talk – Unity Through Flavours; e-Drama and recess activities featuring Active Floor Booth, Kindsville Booth and Photo Booth.

To encourage students' appreciation of the four main races in Singapore and their cultures, we would like to invite students to commemorate the occasion by coming to school in ethnic costumes of the four main races in Singapore on 21 July 2026. However, in the interest of safety, students are to wear their white school shoes and avoid all head accessories as they may pose inconvenience to movements and obstruct their views.

Parents and students are also encouraged to participate in the Family Time activity related to RHD in the Kindsville Times (Primary 1 to 4) and A-OK! (Primary 5 & 6).
