1. Parents Gateway School Cockpit Mobile (PG-SCM) Updates

Thank you for using the PGSCM feature to submit your child's/ward's Medical Certificate (MC) or reason for absence. We trust that this new function has made the submission process more convenient and efficient for you.

For clarity, please note that submissions made through PGSCM will notify the school of your child's/ward's absence from academic lessons only. The information does not automatically extend to Co-Curricular Activities (CCA)/ enrichment programmes as the attendance is managed separately by the teachers-in-charge of CCA and enrichment programmes.

Therefore, if your child/ward is unable to attend CCA/ enrichment programme on the same day, you are required to email the respective CCA / enrichment programme teacher(s) directly. In your email, please include:

- Your child's/ward's full name and class
- Date(s) of absence
- Reason for absence
- Supporting documents, if applicable

This ensures that the teachers in charge of CCA/ enrichment programmes are properly informed and can update attendance records accurately.

We appreciate your understanding and cooperation in helping us maintain clear communication and accurate records. Thank you.

6. RGPS Value Ü Programme 2026

The RGPS Value Ü programme will commence in Term 2, Week 1. The main objective of this programme is to encourage students to appreciate the authentic application of the RGPS values in their daily school life, while nurturing a culture of respect, kindness, and responsibility. A **Value Ü** box will be placed in every P3–P6 classrooms. Once a month, the class's Value Ambassadors (VAs) will lead a brief affirmation activity. Students will write Value Ü slips to acknowledge classmates who have demonstrated positive values that month. These slips will be dropped into the Value Ü box during the week. In the following week, the VAs will draw one affirmation slip to read aloud to the class. All remaining slips will then be distributed to the students who were affirmed. This 5-minute activity will take place during the month's **CCE-FTGP lesson**.

Apart from peers, teachers will also give recognition to students who display the school values and contribute to a caring culture by affirming their actions. Students can look forward to reading these notes of affirmation on the CCE noticeboards.

7. RGPS Value-able for Life Programme

In pursuit of a holistic education that transcends academics, our school will carry out the Value-able for Life programme. This initiative focuses on nurturing character virtues and aims to encourage Primary 3 to 6 students to embody and reflect on the core values of responsibility, resilience, integrity, graciousness and gratitude, fostering character development and building stronger connections between students, teachers, and parents.

The Value-able for Life programme has the following key objectives:

- a. Encourage students to embrace and internalize the school's core values.
- b. Promote character development that extends beyond the classroom.
- c. Foster affirmation.
- d. Engage parents in the process of nurturing values.
- e. Utilize student reflections as valuable insights for parents and teachers.

The Value-able for Life programme will be structured during CCE-FTGP periods once a semester for P3-P6 classes. These sessions will be led by Value Ambassadors (VAs) to inspire and encourage students to examine and reflect on the values that they espouse.

P3 – P6 students will be invited to reflect on the school value(s) that they have displayed most strongly via a take-home Value-Able Reflection worksheet. Parents/Guardians will be informed about this and are encouraged to guide your child/ward in her reflections to help her better develop positive values and embrace her good character. Parents/Guardians will write a note of encouragement / affirmation on the worksheet.
