1. International Friendship Day 2026

The theme for this year's International Friendship Day is "Singapore: Forging Friendships in a Complex World." Our school will commemorate International Friendship Day in Term 2, Week 4.

During this week, students will learn about Singapore's relations with neighbouring countries and the wider world. The commemoration aims to help students better understand Singapore's geopolitical realities and reflect on the importance of:

- maintaining an active foreign policy to safeguard Singapore's international space
- remaining open to the international flow of trade, ideas and talent
- developing cross-cultural skills and a global outlook
- fostering the spirit of friendship and collaboration among people of different cultures

Students will also learn about the culture of the Philippines, the ASEAN Chair for 2026, through fun and engaging activities organised by our Parent Volunteer Group (PVG) during recess. In addition, lessons and activities conducted during FTGP will reinforce students' understanding of ASEAN values such as cooperation and harmony, while helping them develop empathy, social skills, civic literacy and global awareness.

To encourage students' appreciation of different cultures, students are invited to come to school dressed in ethnic costumes from around the world on **13 April 2026**. For safety reasons, students should wear white school shoes and avoid headgear or accessories that may obstruct vision or impede movement.

We seek the support of parents/guardians in discussing with your child/ward the importance of connectedness between Singapore and other countries, especially within ASEAN. You may also participate in the Family Time activity related to International Friendship Day featured in Kindsville Times (Primary 1–4) and A-OK! (Primary 5–6).

Thank you for updating your child's/ward's details. This information is important and helps us keep our records up to date. 3. P5 Prefect Outreach - RMHC Donation Drive 2026@ RGPS from 8 April 2026, Wednesday to 17 April 2026, Friday

The RGPS Prefectorial Board, in collaboration with Ronald McDonald House Charities, has initiated a donation drive to provide "Happy Snack Packs." These packs will support paediatric patients who are receiving outpatient care, undergoing day chemotherapy, or experiencing other medical procedures.

Paediatric patients undergoing outpatient procedures are frequently required to fast prior to treatment. Consequently, the snack packs function as both a nutritional replenishment and a motivational incentive following their procedures. To make these packs even more special, P5 Prefects will organize a dedicated station in the school canteen to collect student-written messages of encouragement, which will be included in the final packs.

Upon the conclusion of the donation drive, the P5 Prefects will assemble snack packs from the collected contributions. Each completed pack will consist of a juice or milk packet, individually wrapped biscuits, and naturally flavoured gummies. These snack packs will then be delivered to RMHC by end of April 2026.

Ultimately, we hope this initiative inspires our pupils to appreciate their own good health while fostering deep empathy and compassion for children facing medical challenges.

Pupils can participate in this collaboration by donating any of the food items listed below:

- Individually Wrapped Snack Bar that **does not contain nuts**
e.g. Carman's / Nature Valley/ Uncle Toby's or Yogood
- Individually wrapped biscuits that **does not contain nuts**

- Individually wrapped gummies with natural flavours

Please note that expiry date of food items must be **at least 6 months away from April 2026**. Pupils can deposit their food items at the table in front of the prefectorial board along the corridor leading to the canteen or at the canteen pick-up point. Items can be dropped off **before morning assembly from 8 April 2026, Wednesday to 17 April 2026, Friday**.

5. Staying Cool and Comfortable: School Uniform and Well-being at RGPS

As we move into warmer months, we want to ensure that our pupils remain comfortable, focused, and ready to learn. We understand that rising temperatures can be a concern for families, and we would like to share the proactive steps we are taking at school to manage the heat.

Classroom Comfort and Hydration - To support a cool learning environment, we have installed **additional fans** in all classrooms to ensure consistent air circulation.

Furthermore, our teaching staff will provide **regular hydration reminders** throughout the day. We ask that you ensure your child brings a labelled, reusable water bottle to school every day.

Uniform Policy and Flexibility - We take great pride in our school uniform, which fosters a sense of belonging and equality. Our policy regarding the **school pinafore** remains in place for the following reasons:

- **Morning Commute:** Early morning temperatures remain relatively mild.
- **Public Transport:** We recognize that many of our pupils travel via air-conditioned buses or trains, where the full uniform provides a comfortable layer against the chill of the AC.

However, we are committed to being practical and empathetic to the children's needs during the peak heat of the day. To that end, we are introducing the following flexibility:

- **During Class:** If a pupil feels uncomfortably warm during lessons, they are permitted to remove their pinafore and remain in their school blouse while inside the classroom.

- **Days with no Physical Education (PE) lessons:** We also understand that some of the girls prefer to wear their PE t-shirts and shorts under their pinafore. On days when they have no PE lessons, pupils will be permitted to wear their PE t-shirts instead of their school blouse to school and thereafter remove their pinafores if they are feeling hot in class.
- **After Physical Education (PE):** We recognize that pupils often feel the heat most intensely following physical activity. After PE lessons, girls may choose to keep their pinafores off for the remainder of the school day while in class.
- **Dismissal:** To maintain our high standards of presentation when representing the school in the community, we ask that all pupils **re-don their pinafores before departing** for the journey home.

Here are some important points to note regarding the wearing of their PE uniform in school:

Guidelines for wearing of PE attire:

- PE attire should adhere to the school's dress code policy as stated in the Student Handbook.
- PE T-shirt must be tucked in when worn at all times.
- Please ensure that PE attire is appropriate, modest, and in good condition.
- Students should still wear appropriate footwear for school activities.

Our goal is to maintain the disciplined environment that helps our pupils thrive while ensuring their physical comfort is never compromised. We appreciate your continued support in helping our students strike this balance.

This temporary permission for wearing PE attire will remain in effect until the weather conditions improve and a return to the full school uniform is deemed appropriate. We will monitor weather forecasts and keep you informed of any changes to this arrangement.

Students should understand that this temporary permission is a privilege and should not be abused.
