1. Issuance of Locker Keys

We are pleased to inform you that the students will be issued with a personal locker this year. Please indicate your interest by indicating a “Yes” on Parents Gateway if you would like your child/ward to have a personal locker by **Monday, 26 January 2026**.

The form teacher will issue one locker key to each student by end of Week 5 i.e. 6 February 2026. The lockers are for students’ use.

The following are the rules for locker use:

- a. Cleanliness of locker. Students are to keep their lockers clean at all times. They are not to draw or paste any sticker on the lockers.
- b. Use of locker. The lockers are meant for the students to put their books and stationery, which they do not wish to bring home. Students are not allowed to put personal items such as jewellery, cash, handphone, electronic or expensive items in the lockers. The school will not be responsible for the loss of such items. No food and snacks are to be put in the lockers.
- c. Loss of locker keys. Students are to be careful with their locker keys. If a key is lost, the student concerned will report the loss to General Office and pay **\$15.00** for a replacement lock. Replacement of locks will only be done in **Week 5 & Week 10 of each term**. Students who have lost their keys will be responsible for any item missing from their lockers during the interim period after school assists them to break open their lockers.
- d. Centralised Key Press in Classrooms for P1 and P2 Students. All P1 and P2 students are to keep their locker keys in a centralised key press situated at the back of the classrooms. The centralised key press will be locked by the teacher before dismissal every day and opened the next day. P1and P2 students are not allowed to bring the locker keys home.

The form teacher will educate the students on the use of lockers. Please also help us to educate our students to be responsible when using their lockers.

2. Assembly Talk and Distribution of Vitagen

We would like to inform you that an assembly talk has been scheduled for our students on **Monday, 2 February**.

As part of the programme, students will be given a serving of **low-sugar Vitagen**. This is provided as part of the talk and is aligned with our school’s efforts to promote healthier food choices among students.

If your child/ward has any dietary restrictions or allergies, please inform the form teacher in advance.

Orders must be submitted by **Friday, 30 January 2026**. We appreciate your cooperation in meeting the deadline as this helps us ensure a smooth experience for all students. Please be aware that the bookshop would not be able to process late submissions or cancellations.

Important Instructions

- Please order only 1 booklet per subject.
- Please order only for the subjects that your child/ward is currently taking.
- If your child/ward is taking Higher Mother Tongue, she will need to order **both** the Higher Mother Tongue and the Mother Tongue PSLE Booklets.
- These booklets will be used in school by the subject teachers during lessons.
- Orders will be collated by the school bookshop. The ordered booklets will be distributed to students in school. You do not need to collect the booklets personally.
- If you have already purchased these booklets, your child/ward may continue to use them at home for revision and practice. However, please note that answer keys that were purchased along with these booklets should not be used by students during school lessons.

As we are only able to host a limited number of participants, only 1 parent/guardian per child/ward is invited to the briefing session. No registration is required.

To join the briefing session, please key in the meeting ID and passcode 10 minutes before the start time as we will start promptly at 2.30pm.

To enhance security, please do not share the ID and passcode with people outside of our school community. Parents/guardian are to log in with your child's/ward's name and class (Example: Dolly Teo 6B).

The slides will be uploaded on the school website by **20 March 2026**.

1.3 CCA

To give the girls balance in the education pursuits, it is important for them to be regular in their CCA attendance. We hope parents will encourage and support the girls in the CCAs so that they will learn perseverance, teamwork, ability to juggle different demands and enjoy the camaraderie and sense of achievement in their CCAs. It is also a good opportunity for the girls to de-stress and do something different.

CCA sessions for P6 will end by Semester 1. For those involved in competitions, there may be further adjustments based on the competition fixtures and the respective CCA teachers will inform you.

This year will be a challenging opportunity for the students but it will also be a precious avenue for families to come together and bond. The time and attention that you specially set aside will make your daughter/ward feel valued and loved. Having regular conversations with one another will allow you to gain deeper insights into what she values and help her find a balance between study and relaxation. Affirm her efforts. Celebrate her successes. Be there for her to guide her in managing the changes and expectations.

The school is committed to working with all of you and we hope to have your cooperation, understanding and support in our collaborative efforts together to educate and care for the students.

4. 2026 P6 Overseas Immersion Programme (Da Nang, Vietnam)

- A. As part of our school's Global Education Programme, our Primary 6 students will be participating in a four-day and three- night overseas immersion programme to Da Nang, Vietnam, in May 2026.
- B. Your child/ward had been briefed on this overseas immersion programme by her Social Studies teacher last week.
- C. The objectives of this overseas immersion programme are to:
 - i. develop our students' 21st Century Competencies and build their confidence and independence;
 - ii. enrich our students' educational experiences, while enhancing people-to-people ties and mutual understanding between youths of Singapore and Vietnam; and
 - iii. provide our students with opportunities to appreciate the cultural heritage of Da Nang, Vietnam.
- D. A brief summary of this overseas immersion programme can be found in Annex A.
- E. A potential participant would be a student who is:
 - medically fit (parents/guardian will need to declare their child's/ward's medical condition at the time of application);
 - exemplary of our RGPS Girl values;
 - independent, a good team-player and has initiative;
 - very interested and able to commit fully to the programme;
 - able to share her knowledge about Singapore with her overseas buddies;
 - committed to sharing her experience at our P6 Graduation events;
 - able to host her overseas buddies in school should the partner school visit Singapore.

- F. Singapore Citizens will receive a 50% subsidy from the MOE TIE Fund and may use their Edusave Funds for the payment of this trip (via Edusave Enrichment Programme Standing Order (EPSO), where applicable). The school will also provide financial assistance to eligible students. Please do take note of the cancellation policy in Annex A.
- G. We are currently inviting applications from potential participants for this overseas immersion programme to Da Nang, Vietnam. In order to provide all students with a fair opportunity to benefit from our school's overseas immersion programmes, each student is entitled to participate in only one overseas learning journey during her upper primary years (Primary 4 to Primary 6). Students who participated in the 2025 P5 Overseas Immersion Trip to Sarawak will not be eligible for this trip.

- I. As part of the application process, there will be a selection procedure to ensure fairness and transparency. This will involve two stages:
 - i) Writing Activity: All interested students will participate in an impromptu writing activity conducted during school hours.
 - ii) Balloting: Based on the quality of submissions, a shortlist of candidates will be drawn up. If the number of shortlisted candidates exceeds the available slots, a balloting process will be conducted to select the final participants.

Please note that the outcome of the ballot and the school's decision are final.

- J. Application for this programme will close on Friday, 30 January 2026 (11.59 pm).
- K. All students selected for this overseas immersion programme are required to attend pre-trip preparatory sessions. In addition, selected students will be required to share their learning experiences with the RGPS community after the trip.

5. P6 Non-Weighted Assessments 2026 (Revised)

In line with MOE's direction to reduce school-based assessment and nurture lifelong learners, the school will not have any mid-year examination for P6. This will also provide our students with more time to adjust to the transition and adapt to the new demands of the level.

Although there is no mid-year examination, students' learning will continue to be monitored and appropriate support will be provided. Current practices to gather information about students' learning through class discussions, homework, topical tests remain to support students' development and achievement in learning.

Bite-sized forms of non-weighted assessments will be conducted in Term 1 and Term 2. The table below shows an overview of the assessment weightings.

There will only be one non-weighted assessment per day and a maximum of 2 non-weighted assessments per week.

Please note that there will be no make-up for non-weighted assessments and preliminary examination. Students who are absent on the day of assessment are to submit valid supporting documents (e.g. medical certificate) via the new feature in Parents Gateway. Performance for that subject would then be indicated as 'VR' (Valid Reason). The overall marks for that subject would then be pro-rated accordingly.

For all other matters pertaining to assessment, please write in to our school and attention it to Principal.
